

Synopsis: Based on real-life events, the film takes place during the guerrilla phase of the Anglo-Boer War (1899-1902). Three officers from an Australian volunteer unit operating at the fringes of British-controlled territory are accused of executing Boer prisoners and murdering a German missionary. The film charts the course of the officers' trial, which is loaded against the Australians from the begining. Despite a spirited defense, the determination of the British authorities to secure a conviction leading to a senior British officer committing perjury. Thus, ensuring the conviction of the accused. Two of the officers are executed by firing squad, while a third is sentenced to life imprisonment.
